Welcome from Gompers' Leadership Team:

To say that our fiscal year 2020 will be a year we'll never forget is an understatement. The first eight months of the year saw our programs growing, we were planning and strategizing for the future of the organization and, in general, everything was shaping up to be another good year for Gompers.

When the COVID-19 pandemic started to weave its way into the fabric of our everyday lives in early 2020 all of those plans and aspirations had to be placed on hold in the interest of the health and safety of our 300+ staff and 500+ students and members. In March 2020, we decided to temporarily suspend our campus-based programs of adult day and center-based employment. We kept open our in-home program, our Gompers Private School converted to remote learning and we continued fulfilling our Business Solutions contracts. While we have faced unprecedented and unexpected challenges since the suspension, in many ways, how we have responded has brought us closer together as a leadership team and we feel encouraged and proud of the work we have done in response to the pandemic.

Through our collaboration with HealthyVerify, the country's only independent medically based, scientific, and professional full-service certification company, Gompers developed a comprehensive plan and became certified to re-open its programs safely. As a result of this collaboration, our facilities were updated to accommodate the new reality of social distancing, use of personal protective equipment, and on-going enhanced cleaning. When we started to re-open our campus-based programs to members in August 2020, staff returned to work only after having been fully trained on the HealthVerify plan. While change doesn't necessarily come easy, everyone has accepted that 2020 is all about change and adapting.

We remain encouraged and hopeful as we navigate our way through these unprecedented times. Our emphasis will continue to focus on providing a safe, meaningful, and hopefully enjoyable environment for our members, students, and staff. We hope that soon, we'll be able to return to the full range of activities we enjoyed before the pandemic. Either way, our commitment to the people we support, their families, and our staff will remain at the core of everything we do. Thank you for your involvement, your interest and your belief in Gompers.

Gompers' Response to COVID-19

Gompers contracted with HealthyVerify to develop and implement health and safety protocols, which follow local and state mandated guidelines and those recommended by the federal Centers for Disease Control. Under the HealthyVerify certification, Gompers continued to safely provide innovative opportunities for individuals with disabilities during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Staff, members, and students at all Gompers' locations are required to complete a daily health screening, which includes a temperature check prior to entering the building

- Staff are required to wear masks at all times in program areas
- Members and students are strongly encouraged to wear masks
- Staff is using virtual meeting technology to meet the needs of members and students staying at home
- Visitors are only allowed in the building if they have been pre-approved
- Cafeterias have switched to online ordering and contactless delivery
- All in-person events or gatherings have been cancelled
- Social distancing is being maintained in program rooms and on transport vehicles
- Enhanced cleaning protocols of program rooms, restrooms, and hallways have been implemented

Our Story

Gompers Day Training for Adults (DTA) operates two programs in the valley -- one in Phoenix and one in Peoria. We strive to use every opportunity to assist our members in developing the skills necessary for independence. Gompers' programs focus on activities in the community where members can explore what they are learning, while practicing life and communication skills guided by trained staff. Preparing members for independence and self-sufficiency is an integral part of our philosophy.

Pre-COVID-19, our Phoenix campus supported 214 DTA members with a variety of room options, including total care, senior care, and pre-employment. Our Blythe campus in Peoria, now in its third year of operations, continued to grow and counted 91 members prior to the pandemic. Both programs participated in special outings around the valley and offered volunteer opportunities while supporting their local communities. Also, thanks to a generous donation, DTA members were able to participate in exciting field trips like Bearizona, World Wildlife Zoo, and OdySea Aquarium.

Gompers temporarily suspended its campus-based programs at the end of March 2020. Gompers' staff got creative and began to support its DTA members using virtual technology with tele-DTA services. Starting with an initial group of 11 participants, DTA staff provided 41 hours of services. Tele-DTA eventually grew to 47 participants and 419 hours of service a month. This was a lifeline to people who would have otherwise been isolated during the suspension of services. Using Zoom for tele-DTA, members stayed in contact with staff and friends and continued to participate in their Readtopia reading curriculum.

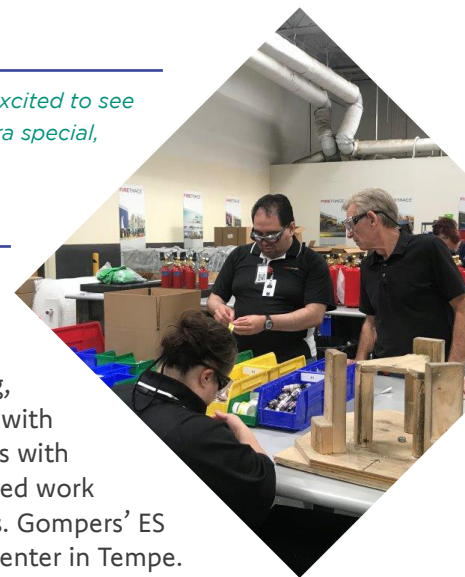

Our Story

With community-based job sites across the valley, Gompers Employment Services (ES) works with a multitude of business customers in a variety of settings that includes ongoing, seasonal, and as-needed business solutions services. We support over 100 ES participants with 3 main programs. Individual Supported Employment, provides newly employed participants with a one-on-one job coach. Group Supported Employment (GSE), a community based, assisted work program that allows individuals to develop skills while working on-site at local companies. Gompers' ES operates 15 GSE sites including participation in a mixed-lease cooperative business center in Tempe. Center-Based Employment, located in Glendale, offers participants a safe and supportive environment for pre-employment skill building with more structure and supervision by Gompers' staff. Employment Services has had great results with the expansion of Readtopia. Gompers Private School loaned out four tablets for students to participate virtually during the school building closure. "This was definitely a challenging time for us all, but we learned how to adapt to virtual learning during the pandemic," said Aurelia Tahy, Employment Services Instructor.

Home and Community Based Services

Our Story

Located at our Blythe campus in Peoria, Gompers Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) serves 80+ members with respite, attendant care, and habilitation services. These services are provided by qualified employees dedicated to providing the best possible experience to families and their loved ones. HCBS's services assist families in caring for a loved one with disabilities. During the COVID-19 pandemic, HCBS provided a continuum of services to members and their families while many DTA programs suspended their programs. "While the pandemic has forced the world to distance themselves, it

Our Story

Gompers Private School (GPS) began the 2019-2020 school year with two new educators and 13 students. GPS enrolled students from seven different school districts and increased enrollment for students using the Empowerment Scholarship Account. The enthusiasm of the new teachers, Jasmyn Gonzalez (elementary classroom) and Taylor Blascak (high school classroom) energized the students through volunteering at an assisted living facility and greater participation in the community. Student successes included one individual who graduated high school with a diploma from her school district in May, a second graduated from high school in December, and three students transitioned back to a public school district after attending GPS.



Governor Ducey's March 10, 2020 order to close school buildings occurred during Gompers' spring break. When staff returned the following Monday, a plan was implemented to contact families and assess their individual needs for remote learning. Concurrently, GPS communicated to its school district partners its on-going commitment to provide a quality education to its students. True to this commitment, during the next several days, GPS staff drove hundreds of miles across the Valley delivering school materials, technology, and worksheets to students while teachers prepared to transition to an online education format. In addition, lessons were recorded and uploaded to the internet so that parents, caregivers, and students could work at their own pace, further ensuring that learning was possible at any time of the day or night.

When it became clear that students would not be returning to the classrooms before the end of the school year, Gompers staff began planning graduation celebrations for graduating students. “It was very important that we celebrate the hard work and accomplishments of our students,” said Gompers Director of Special Education Travis Harris. The result was a drive-by graduation ceremony for each of the graduates. A caravan of cars drove to the home of each of the students in order to honor and recognize them and their scholastic achievement. Every attempt to make this day special and exceptional was made. Our efforts paid off as GPS student, Xochitl Camacho, was so excited to see her friends and teachers, that she went outside first thing in the morning and waited for the caravan to arrive. As a special surprise, Xochitl’s retired kindergarten teacher came to say “Good job, Xochitl!” For all of us, it was a very special day!

Transportation Services

Our Story

Gompers transported more than 350 members and students on a daily basis, Valley wide, prior to the pandemic. Each day our large fleet of accessible vans were on Valley roadways to transport individuals safely and reliably to and from Gompers. Assisting in this extraordinary effort is Geotab, our GPS-tracking system.

Geotab tracks each vehicle in real time and provides valuable data on the vehicle, its location at all times, and the drivers’ driving habits.

Gompers maintains its vehicle fleet in accordance with the manufacturer’s recommended maintenance standards and its drivers, prior to each trip, check the vehicles for safety purposes. This year, through a Maricopa Association of Government’s grant, we received five 2020 Dodge Caravans to build our fleet and serve more members. During the year we had 43 daily routes and drove over 565,000 miles.

Gompers’ drivers have an overwhelming dedication to its members in making sure they always feel safe and comfortable when being transported.

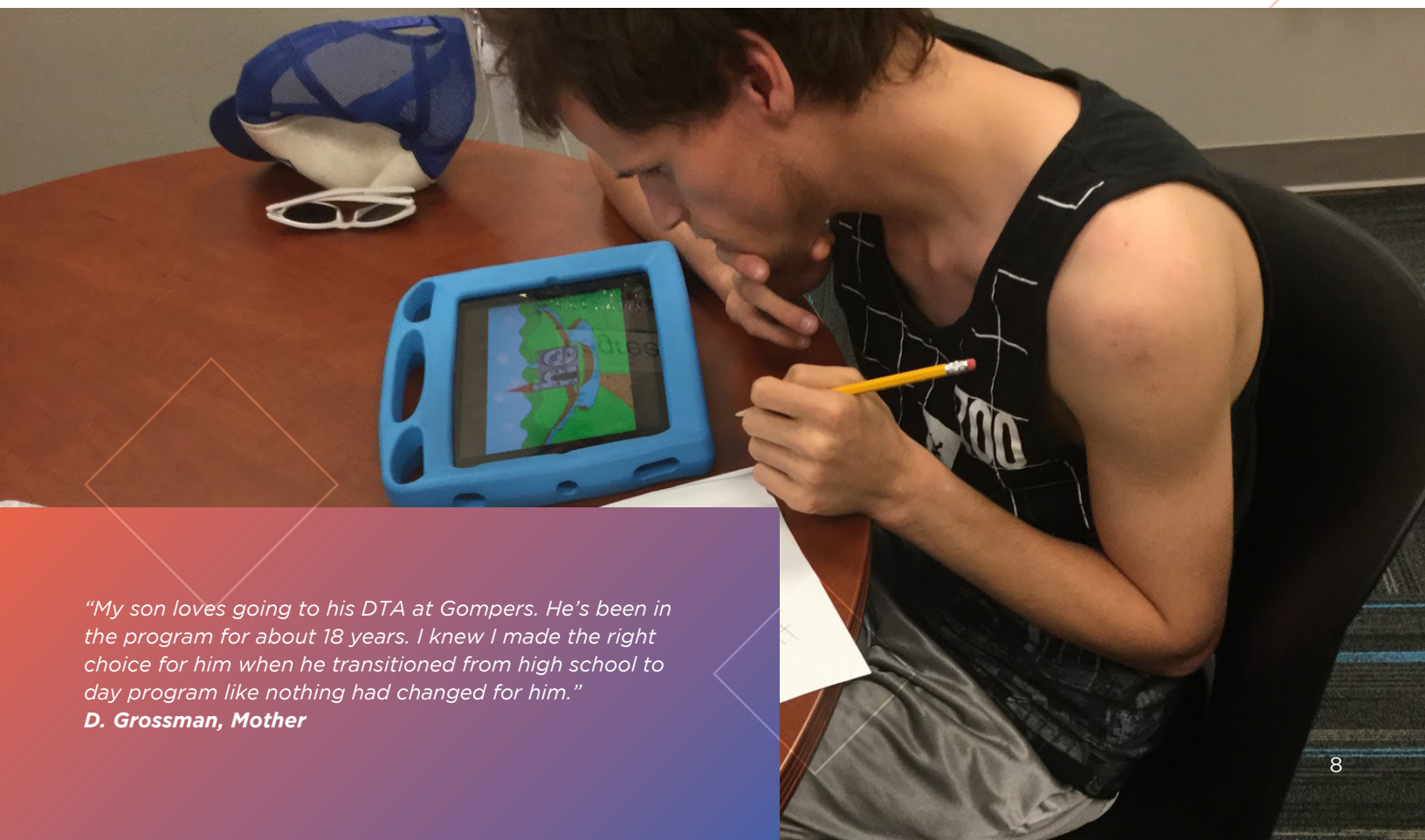
Our Story

Assistive Technology is an integral part of all Gompers' programs and range in complexity from "low tech", for example picture schedules and tactile materials for visually impaired students, to "high tech" such as Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) devices and reader pens. We continue to focus on the use of assistive technology as a means of improving our members' functional capabilities. The importance of having an assistive technology program was never more evident than during the temporary suspension when we were able to use technology to reach out to members' and their families for remote learning purposes.

Prior to the temporary suspension of campus-based services, we were actively using technology through the Readtopia program in the majority of our DTA program rooms. Through this program we create opportunities for members to learn to read, thereby opening a whole new world to them. The response from members has been and continues to be overwhelmingly positive.

"I have seen members who were not able to read develop their literacy skills to the point they are able to read independently," said Jason Schraven, former Readtopia Literacy Instructor.

Gompers continued its Readtopia sessions via Zoom during the temporary suspension. Through these online sessions we reached more than 100 members through 29 separate classes. As campus-based programs have re-opened, we expect those numbers to increase. We also plan to continue providing remote classes for those who have health and safety concerns.

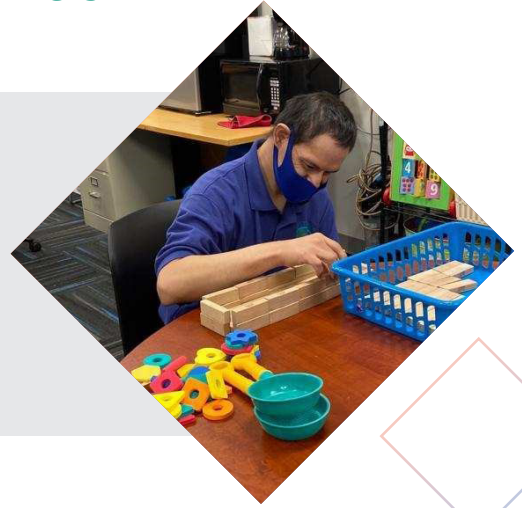
